

ANTI-STONE

(Film-Coated Tablets)

Composition & Excipients:

Each ANTI-STONE film-coated tablet contains the following powders and herbal extracts:

Extracts: *Didymocarpus pedicellata*: 130 mg, *Saxifraga ligulata*: 98 mg, *Rubia cordifolia*: 32 mg, *Cyperus scariosus*: 32 mg, *Achyranthes aspera*: 32 mg, *Onosma bracteatum*: 32 mg, *Vernonia cinerea*: 32 mg.

Powders: Shilajeet Purified: 26 mg, and Hajrul yahood Bhasma: 32 mg.

Processed in: *Ocimum basilicum*, *Dolichos biflorus*, *Tribulus terrestris*, *Mimosa pudica*, *Pavonia odrata*, *Equisetum arvense*, *Tectona grandis* seed.

Excipients: Microcrystalline cellulose, HPMC, Aerosil, Magnesium stearate, Ethyl cellulose, Titanium dioxide, Talc, Propylene glycol, Iron oxide yellow.

Pharmacotherapeutic group: Lithotryptic (disintegrate renal and urinary calculi), urinary antiseptic.

Mechanism of Action:

ANTISTONE prevents supersaturation of lithogenic substances, controls oxamides (a substance that precipitates stone formation) absorption from the intestine and corrects the crystalloid-colloid imbalance. ANTI-STONE inhibits calculogenesis by reducing stone forming substances like oxalic acid, calcium hydroxyproline, etc., and causes their expulsion by micropulverization. ANTI-STONE causes disintegration of the calculi and the crystals by acting on the mucin, which binds the particles together. ANTI-STONE's antimicrobial activity is beneficial in the prevention of urinary tract infections associated with urinary stones and crystalluria. ANTI-STONE's antispasmodic and anti-inflammatory activities relieve ureteric colic and alleviate symptoms of painful and burning micturition.

Indications:

1.Urolithiasis:

- oxalate stones.
- phosphate stones.
- urate stones and uric acid salts.
- crystalluria.
- mixed crystals.
- glycolic acids.
- prevent recurrence after surgery.

2.As an adjuvant in:

- urinary tract infections.
- urinary tract infections during pregnancy.
- non-specific urethritis.
- cystitis, pyelitis.
- burning micturition.
- gout and hyperuricemia.
- 3.Urinary incontinence in women.
- 4.Sialolithiasis.



Contraindications:

There are no absolute contraindications.

Dosage:

Urolithiasis and crystalluria: 2 tablets twice daily. Therapy should be continued till the macroscopic and radiographic evidence of expulsion of calculus is obtained.

Urinary infections: 2 tablets twice daily, for 1 to 2 weeks, followed by 1 tablet twice daily till the patient feels asymptomatic.

Burning micturition: 1 tablet thrice daily, till the symptoms subside.

Prophylaxis after surgical intervention: 1 tablet twice daily for 2 to 3 months.

Precautions: It is advisable not to be recommended in obstructive uropathy due to larger stones.

Adverse effects: None.

Drug interactions: None.

Special warnings: None.

Undesirable Effects: None.

Packaging:

3 blisters (Aluminium/Aluminium), each contains 10 film-coated tablets/carton box.

Storage Conditions:

Keep out of reach of children

Store in a dry place, below 25° C, away from direct sunlight.
Do not refrigerate.
